Rahovitza is a mountain retreat, a center for experimentation, learning and exchange on topics related to alternative food gardening, ecological building, re-skilling and personal development. We are located 1km outside and above the village of Kosovo in the Bulgarian Rhodope Mountains, on a south facing hill at an altitude of 980m, surrounded by forest.

How to get there:

Low-cost airlines to Bulgaria: www.wizzair.com, www.ryanair.com
From Sofia: Take bus to Plovdiv from central bus station
From Plovdiv: Take bus direction Smolian from bus station Rhodopi

Get off 2km after the stop Naretshenki Bani (1h from Plovdiv) at the bifurcation to Kosovo (tell the driver) and walk or hitchhike to Kosovo village (3km), ask for Rahovitza.

FOREST GARDEN AND PERMACULTURE INTRODUCTION

Dates: April 4-9 (6 full days)

Course fee: 470 €

Kick-off your gardening season with a hands-on demonstration of a subsistence food garden for a cool, temperate climate.

This 6-days course develops the participants' abilities to assess and implement a permaculture garden project in cool, temperate climate regions, such as the Balkan region and northern Europe. Beginning with thoughtful observation and careful planning, into the building and enriching of soil, to the propagation and maintenance of both annual and perennial food plants; this course provides the beginner gardener with the foundations of designing a garden for your kitchen, and intermediate and advanced gardeners will have a place to share ideas and learn something new.

This course weaves theory, practice and discussion to suit a variety of learning styles. Participants get the opportunity to put some innovative gardening techniques into action, and will come away with fresh ideas for food gardens of their own.

STONE CARVING RETREAT

Dates: June 8-11 (4 full days)

Course fee: 340 €

Escape from your everyday activity and discover the pleasure of manual creativity in an unspoiled mountain retreat.

During this 4-day course you will have the opportunity to smith your own tools, you will learn the basic techniques for working stones and you will have the opportunity to make your own piece of art under the supervision of two talented sculptors.

This manual effort will give you the space to reflect on your personal needs and to re-connect to Nature in an overwhelmingly beautiful landscape. There will be time left for excursions in the mountains and neighboring villages.

EARTH BUILDING WORKSHOP

Course fee: 390 €

Get a basic understanding of earth as a building material and practice earth building techniques

During this seminar you will learn about the characteristics of earth as a building material, the field tests that enable you to identify the right soil for building and the main earth building techniques. You will have a practical experience on adobe making, straw-earth infill and plastering.

A guided excursion to nearby villages will give you the opportunity to further explore traditional building techniques and their possible adaptation to modern requirements.

We will serve three meals per day and intermediate fruit and snacks. You will be able to discover traditional Bulgarian dishes and home-made rakia, made from local, organic sources. Depending on the season, we will treat you also with our own harvest.
